### **Course Description:**

The fifth workshop in our Nature-Based Exchange workshop series explores the role of equity in natural and nature-based solutions. Designed as a combination of presentations and interactive breakout groups, attendees will learn what is holding communities back from utilizing nature-based solutions as they are exposed to techniques that enhance the capacity and voice of a community. A Q&A panel discussion will allow for the free-sharing of questions, thoughts, and ideas while breakout groups will promote conversation and actionable steps. Held at the historic Penn Center on St. Helena Island, this workshop will educate, inspire, and prepare attendees to better incorporate equity into nature-based projects across South Carolina.

#### Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Participants will learn what role equity currently plays in natural and nature-based solutions. Topics covered include: what steps can be taken to make nature-based solutions more equitable; what is holding communities back from utilizing nature-based solutions; and what work is being done to enhance a community's capacity and voice.
- 2. Participants will learn about the historic Penn Center the first school in the south for formerly enslaved West Africans and will explore the grounds.
- 3. Participants will engage in breakout groups that will result in actionable next steps for their organization and for South Carolina.
